Curriculum Introduction

Intent

Our intention is that when children leave Brownhills Ormiston Academy, they do so with the knowledge, understanding and emotions to be able to play an active role in today's society. We want our children to have high aspirations, a belief in themselves and realise that anything is possible if they put their mind to it. We want our pupils to:

Develop a confidence in sharing their own thoughts and opinions with others

Develop skills and attributes to keep themselves healthy and safe

Develop an attitude of a responsible global citizen

To show tolerance of others beliefs, religions and life choices

To build positive, respectful relationships with other people

<u>Implementation</u>

KS3 students at our academy receive a 60-minute PSHE lesson with a PSHE teacher, every week, KS4 students receive a 60-minute lesson every fortnight. We separate our PSHE curriculum into themes, with carefully crafted resources created to scaffold learning effectively for students. Staff CPD is provided to support staff delivery of PSHE and train new staff in effective practice, particularly when dealing with sensitive topics. Our 'Theme of the Week' is explored in the academy through assemblies, tutorial activities in form time and through displays and resources around school. External visitors support our PSHE curriculum including performance from Theatre in Education groups and visiting speakers. We also have an enrichment programme that supports our PSHE curriculum and ethos with two Equality & Diversity groups and a debating society to develop student oracy.

Impact

We firmly believe that a meaningful PSHE curriculum is the key to children becoming confident, tolerant and well-rounded adults.

- Children can approach a range of real-life situations and apply their skills and attributes to help navigate themselves through modern life.
- From exposure to a range of global issues and problems, children can build up tolerance and a sense of responsibility of being a global citizen.
- This will be actively assessed in lessons through regular self-assessment, varied opportunities for reflective practice from students, alongside ongoing observations from members of staff.
