- You can only choose one Art course either Graphic Art or Fine Art
- Vocational courses each have an element of controlled assessment. These take place during set time frames in exam conditions. Attendance at these sessions is compulsory. Failure to attend can put you at risk of a grade U.
- Vocational course are awarded at either a level 1 or a level 2 depending on the standard reached in all assessment elements.
