The Purpose of Parent/Carer Surveys

The primary goal of parent/carer surveys is to provide valuable parent opinions, perspectives and perceptions towards the academy and towards students to improve the learning environment in general or specific ways. Survey feedback also supports the academy to provide parents/carers information and guidance about a range of educational matters and supports academy leaders to focus on improvement items that matter and are important to parents/carers.

At Brownhills Ormiston Academy (BOA), we value the input of our parents / carers and research has shown that parental involvement in school has a significant impact on pupil performance. Family engagement in the academy can reduce absenteeism and can lead to better social skills, improved learning behaviours and academic outcomes.

We would like to thank all 83 parents / carers, who completed this year's survey December- January.

Parent / Carer Survey Results (March 2025)

What do the results tell us and the academy's follow up / response work

The parent / carer survey results are positive.

In all areas, approval has exceeded previous survey results (surveys in 2022 and 2023)

The results (a full set of which can be found on the following pages) show that the academy has good standards across a range of areas.

Over 90% of responders agreed or strongly agreed that

- their child feels safe at the academy
- their child is given clear guidance on how to behave.
- the academy promotes the importance of good attendance and encourages my child to attend regularly.
- the academy enables their child to understand the importance of attending school regularly.
- the academy encourages their child to be a good timekeeper and to be punctual.

Between 80- 90% of responders agreed or strongly agreed that

- their child is happy at BOA
- their child makes good progress
- their child is taught well
- lessons include challenge
- their child receives the appropriate amount of homework
- rewards are received
- pupils behave well

- BOA encourages online safety
- parents receive adequate communication
- parents would recommend BOA to a family moving into the area

It is reassuring and pleasing that the improvement and development work of the last few years is being acknowledged and well received by pupils and parents/carers. The academy continues to drive forward a range of improvement strategies to be meet and exceed high academic and pastoral educational standards.

Ofsted

The November 2024 Ofsted inspection has been supportive and informative for the senior leadership of the academy. The journey of improvement and the appropriate choice of development strategies have been positively referenced by Ofsted. Ofsted's feedback is guiding the academy on our mission of driving academic rigour and preparing our pupils to be ready for life as responsible young adults.

Students have a minimum of one week to complete their home learning.

Some parents have said that their child receives a lot of homework and have asked why it is necessary. We want our students to achieve, and to be successful requires hard work and learning.

The academy also wants students to be ready for the step into GCSE course requirements, and then beyond. The GCSE course requirements under the government's current GCSE system demands a lot in terms of content and exam standards.

No matter how hard it is for a child, we encourage every student to get into good home study and homework habits, so they can cope with the exam courses' workload from year 10. Homework set in years 7-9 is very important.

We want our students to be competitive with other peers as they enter the next stage of their education, work or training, therefore, they must aim to attain the best grades that they can.

Emotional wellbeing work in school

Emotional wellbeing is taught through PSHE lessons, assemblies and in cross-curricular lessons where appropriate, e.g., how eating healthily and exercise impact your emotional wellbeing in Food Technology and Physical Education.

The academy has a qualified Mental Health Lead, Mrs Chaplin, Senior Vice Principal, and a mental health development plan.

Every member of staff has completed training on how to support students' emotional health. Every child has created a student profile with their personal tutors to help identify some of the challenges they may face to their emotional health and build resilience in how to overcome them.

 About our counselling services Students are regularly reminded in PSHE, during the end of half term assemblies, and during the start of term assemblies where they can get help for their emotional health, and they have free access to KOOTH, School Nursing Chat and all parents and children are encouraged to download the SaferSchools App, which has access to support for emotional health.

The academy's Reflexions (mental health practitioners) team are present at parents' evening and on-hand to give advice to students and parents. Apps that are available to support mental and emotional health are advertised throughout the school day on televisions and on posters and business cards for all students and visitors to the school. The staff work closely with students and parents, with external agencies if additional support is required.

The academy subscribes to 3 different counselling services, which come on site every week. The pastoral team liaise with students and families if these services might be appropriate for a child to access. Students have reported that they find counselling helpful.

Students being aware of road safety

Road safety is of vital importance, especially as many of our students walk down main roads, including the busy A5, to get to school. We remind students about road safety in PSHE and during form time.

Every year, we welcome a theatre company to BOA to perform a high impact play about road safety for our Year 7 students. We do this in September, so that they receive messages about staying safe as they travel to their new school.

We encourage parents and carers to reinforce these messages about road safety.

Anti-bullying work

All staff complete mandatory safeguarding and safety training, which includes informing staff how to support a child in need.

Bi-monthly staff briefings are dedicated to safeguarding issues, led by a Designated Senior Leader, and staff are kept up to date with information and training.

Students are taught to identify what bullying is, how to report bullying, and how bullying can happen (face-to-face, online) through PSHE, form time and assemblies. They are also taught how to protect themselves from bullying online.

Students are explicitly taught about protected characteristics, the law and groups of people who are more likely to be bullied.

The academy celebrates anti-bullying week each year, and the culture of celebrating what makes us different and the values of respecting each other are embedded in every lesson in the curriculum.

Students are regularly reminded that they can report any friendship and bullying issues to any adult in the academy, to include

- Personal tutors
- Teachers
- Pastoral Support Leaders (PSLs)
- Senior Teachers
- Support staff: receptionists, admin staff, site staff and teaching assistants

School trips

Many trips and visits take place each year, and very large number of students participate throughout their time at Brownhills.

Mrs Mitchell, Associate Assistant Principal, works closely with departments to put together a comprehensive 'curriculum enrichment calendar' to support experiences outside the classroom.

In the autumn term 2024 alone, the academy ran a range of trips and visits (internal and external).

Many trips gather a lot of interest, which is great, and limited spaces can fill up fast. We know that sometimes students can be disappointed about spaces not being available; however, with the variety and number that we run, all students will get an opportunity (subject to meeting any behaviour and attendance requirements).

In terms of staffing, we can only allow a certain number of staff to be out of the academy at any one time on a trip as their lessons must be covered by supply teachers, which incurs a significant cost to the academy, so we must plan student numbers appropriately to meet the required ratios, to keep costs as affordabble as possible and to ensure that teaching still takes place whilst staff are leading trips.

Are we planning more trips abroad?

We hold an annual Disneyland Paris trip in July each year and in Sepetmber 2025, we are holding our first trip to Belgium, a music tour.

Over recent years the costs of donestic and overseas trips have almost doubled, and we want to make all trips accessible and affordable, so we will plan trips abroad at spaced intervals to allow families to make payments. In addition to our families being able to afford trips, our school is small, so we must be able to fill trips, and our staff must volunteer their time on trips, so we must plan any overseas trip to factor in all considerations.

We hold face-to-face parent consultation evenings for every year group during academic year 2023-24.










13. The school encourages my child to take part in extracurricular clubs and activities






20. BOA promotes safety, including road safety and teaches my child how to keep safe


21. My child is encouraged to speak up if they are concerned about bullying








23. Do you feel that your child is being prepared for a future career through work that we do on careers education?


24. My child feels confident to talk to a member staff if they have a problem






25. BOA promotes the importance of good attendance and encourages my child to attend regularly






26. My child understands the importance of attending school regularly






27. The academy encourages my child to be a good timekeeper and to be punctual






